Key Story: "The Same in the Dark"		
Caleb, a man in a city full of corruption, chose to stand for truth even when no one was watching. When faced with a moral dilemma at work, he remembered his grandfather's words:		
"Real integrity is being the same person when no one is watching." He acted not to expose, but to honor God.		
√ What Is Integrity, Really?		
Being whole, undivided, and honest in all situations		
Not just doing the right thing in public—but doing right when God alone sees		
Living the same inside and outside, under pressure and in peace		
Integrity includes:		
Boundaries – You don't cross the line morally		
Consistency – You're dependable daily		
Predictability – Others can trust your word		
Proverbs 11:3:		
"The integrity of the upright will guide them."		

\$\$ God Is Truth. Satan Is a Liar.

- God = Ultimate Truth.
- Satan = Father of lies.
- Every lie pulls you away from God.
- Telling the truth reflects your identity as a child of God.

Integrity in Daily Life

- Not perfection, but honesty about imperfection
- If you sin—go quickly to God, confess, and walk again in truth
- 🆈 "Integrity says: If I sin, I'll go to the Father and confess it."

What the Bible Teaches About Integrity

- pon't exaggerate or flatter
- pon't steal time, things, or attention
- Return what you borrow

Numbers 23:19:

"God is not a man that He should lie."

(iii) Keeping Priorities Straight

- Caleb learned to put God first, even over work or ministry.
- Jesus called the disciples to "be with Him" (Mark 3:14)
- Mary chose to sit at Jesus' feet and Jesus said she chose the better part (Luke 10:42)

Real-Life Integrity: Apostle Paul

- Confronted Peter when he compromised (Gal. 2:11–12)
- Lived aware that **God sees everything** (2 Cor. 11:31)
- Preached and practiced what he believed

✓ The Integrity Test (Self-Check)

Ask yourself:

- Do I keep my word?
- Am I honest with money and time?
- Do I speak truth in love?
- Do I exaggerate, gossip, or flatter?
- Do I trust God to protect me when others wrong me?
