Faithfulness vs. Loyalty

What is Faithfulness?

Faithfulness = Consistency and reliability in responsibilities.



It's about stewardship, doing what is right even when unseen.



Scriptures: Luke 16:10, 1 Corinthians 4:2.




Example: Joseph managing Potiphar's house with integrity.

What is Loyalty?


Loyalty = Wholehearted commitment in relationships.



It's about covenant, love, and standing by others.



Scriptures: 1 Samuel 18 (Jonathan and David), Deut. 6:4–5.



Loyalty shows devotion beyond personal gain or convenience.

Key Differences



Faithfulness focuses on tasks;
loyalty focuses on people.



You can be faithful in action
but disloyal in heart.



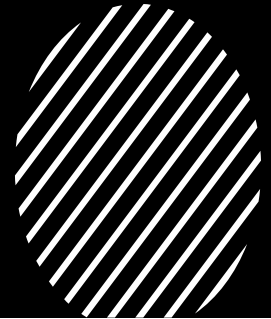
Faithfulness is doing the right
thing; loyalty is staying
committed.



Faithfulness = what you do;
Loyalty = who you're for.

integrity.


Faithfulness

Jesus was both
faithful (Hebrews
2:17) and loyal
(Hebrews 13:5).



Summary and Scripture
